Biography



At the base of Zinkpe's work are human-sized sculptures, strange figures made from tree branches, iron wire and textiles. The deformed branches that form the construction of the sculptures at times resemble the roots of the mangrove. These personages combine an animalistic and natural appearance with human characteristics. They refer to social and political situations in. Zinkpe's daily life at local, regional and international levels, such as political injustice, religion and AIDS. Among his recent solo shows are 'Parcours intime', Ecole d'Arts Plastiques Paul Belmondo, Rosny-sous-Bois (2012); 'Confessions. Miroirs de l'Intime', Fine Art Studio, Brussels (2013) and 'Ceremonial', Institut Francais, Pointe Noire, Congo (2013). His group participations include 'The Spirit of Africa: Dominique Zinkpe — LeonPollux', Museum Haus der Volker, Schwaz, Austria (2009); 'VisionaryAfrica', Palais des Beaux-Arts, Brussels (2010); 'Totem', Fondation Jean-Paul Blachere, Apt (2013) and 'Impressions d'Afrique II.
