

EN biography Mustapha Hafid

Mustapha Hafid, born in 1942 in Casablanca, stands as a prominent figure in Moroccan modern art. In 1958, he joined the École des Beaux-Arts de Casablanca, an institution then steeped in European academic traditions. During his three years there, during his three years of training, Hafid developed a profound passion for drawing, which he regarded as the essential foundation of all artistic creation. His skill quickly set him apart as he immersed himself in observation and life drawing classes under the mentorship of Monsieur Verdi, along with plaster modeling and sketching courses led by Michel Courteaux. Under the tutelage of Félix Bellenot, Hafid honed his painting techniques, while Monsieur Cheneau introduced him to the art of poster design.

Seeking to expand his artistic scope, Mustapha Hafid secured a Polish government scholarship to pursue advanced studies in Europe. Though he considered various renowned institutions, he ultimately selected Poland, influenced by his cousin, painter Ahmed Cherkaoui, who praised the Warsaw Academy of Fine Arts after a formative year-long residency. From 1961 to 1968, Hafid settled in Warsaw, where he earned a master's degree in 1966. It was here that Hafid met Anna Draus, a fellow Academy graduate who would become both his wife and a profound influence on his artistic journey.

At the Warsaw Academy, Hafid studied under eminent figures such as Artur Nacht-Samborski and Michał Bylina, who guided his early explorations in form and expression. After earning his degree, he extended his training at the Pablo Picasso Studio of Graphic Arts under Józef Pakulski's direction. Driven by an insatiable curiosity, Hafid delved into diverse artistic disciplines, affirming his autonomy by resisting alignment with any single style or school.

In 1966, Hafid made a pivotal decision to abandon figuration entirely, dedicating himself to abstraction. Deeply influenced by Polish avant-garde movements and Władysław Strzemiński's Unism, he began to forge a distinct visual language marked by organic lines and sinuous shapes, moving away from traditional geometric compositions to express a profound subjectivity.

Upon his return to Morocco in 1968, Hafid took up a position at the École des Beaux-Arts de Casablanca as a professor of drawing and painting. The school soon became a vibrant center of creative and intellectual activity, fueling the development of a modern Moroccan art movement that consciously broke from colonial legacies and embraced local cultural realities. Hafid played an active role in the Casablanca Group's exhibitions, most notably the manifesto shows of 1969 at Place Jamâa El Fna in Marrakech—alongside artists like Ataallah, Belkahia, Chabâa, Hamidi, and Melehi—and at Place du 16 novembre in Casablanca, events that marked defining moments in Moroccan art history.

Hafid's work, often linked to expressionism and fauvism for its bold, intense palette, drew inspiration from artists such as Paul Klee and Vassily Kandinsky. In his hands, color, form, and emotion became tools not for depicting visible reality but for unveiling internal states. His canvases pulse with dynamic energy, using color as an expressive force to capture sensations and emotional landscapes that transcend the mere replication of the physical world.

During the turbulent 1980s in Morocco, Hafid was appointed twice as director of the École Supérieure des Beaux-Arts de Casablanca where he introduced key reforms. Even amid the challenges, he continued to produce work, his style shifting toward darker tones and a stronger use of black. His compositions then reflected a baroque gravity that marked a new stage in his artistic maturity.

Hafid has been instrumental in shaping Moroccan modern art. By engaging with, yet moving beyond, European influences, he forged a distinct visual language that affirmed Moroccan identity on an international platform. His career demonstrates how Moroccan artists can engage global art movements while creating a modernity anchored in local culture. Through his work and commitment, Hafid remains a central figure in contemporary art, redefining the landscape of art history in Morocco and beyond. As a founding member of the Moroccan Association of Plastic Arts and a member of the Polish Association of Plastic Artists, he has continued to move between Poland and Morocco, embodying a cross-cultural perspective that enriches his legacy.
